

The Latvian soprano **Katrīna Paula Felsberga** made her debut as Adina in Donizetti's *L'elisir d'amore* at the Latvian National Opera at the start of the 2024/25 season. In May 2025, she will make her debut as Emilia in Handel's *Flavio, re de' Langobardi* at the Latvian National Opera. Previously, she performed roles such as Zerlina in Mozart's *Don Giovanni* and Giannetta in Donizetti's *L'elisir d'amore*.

In 2024, Katrīna was honored with the Latvian Great Music Award as "Young Artist of the Year," the highest state accolade in Latvia's music industry. She has also performed with the Latvian National Symphony Orchestra, Sinfonietta Riga, and the Liepāja Symphony Orchestra.

Felsberga is equally dedicated to the Lied and chamber music genres. As an alumna of the Heidelberger Frühling Lied Academy under the direction of Thomas Hampson, she has given recitals at the Pierre Boulez Saal in Berlin with Graham Johnson and Malcolm Martineau, as well as at the Heidelberger Frühling Liedfestival, where she participated in an experimental Lied.LAB exploring the intersections between Western and Eastern cultures. Katrīna's 2024 highlights include a solo recital at Rachmaninoff's Villa Senar in Lucerne, a performance at the Konzerthaus Berlin with organist Iveta Apkalna, her participation in the LiederWerkstatt at the Kissinger Sommer festival, and a song recital with Malcolm Martineau at the Dzintari Concert Hall in Latvia.

A passionate advocate for contemporary music, Felsberga has premiered and commissioned works by composers such as Oscar Bianchi, Christian Jost, and Jēkabs Jančevskis, among others. Most recently, she appeared with Ensemble Modern in Stuttgart and with Ensemble l'Itinéraire at IRCAM in Paris.

In 2024, she was a finalist at the Bundeswettbewerb Gesang, where she won the prize for Best Interpretation of a Contemporary Piece. She has also participated in the academies of LIEDBasel, the Gstaad Menuhin Festival Vocal Academy, and the Lotte Lehmann Akademie for young opera singers.

Born in Riga, Latvia, Felsberga studied at the Riga Cathedral Choir School, where she earned a diploma in classical singing and choir conducting. She later completed her bachelor's degree at the University of the Arts Berlin. Currently, she is based in Berlin.
